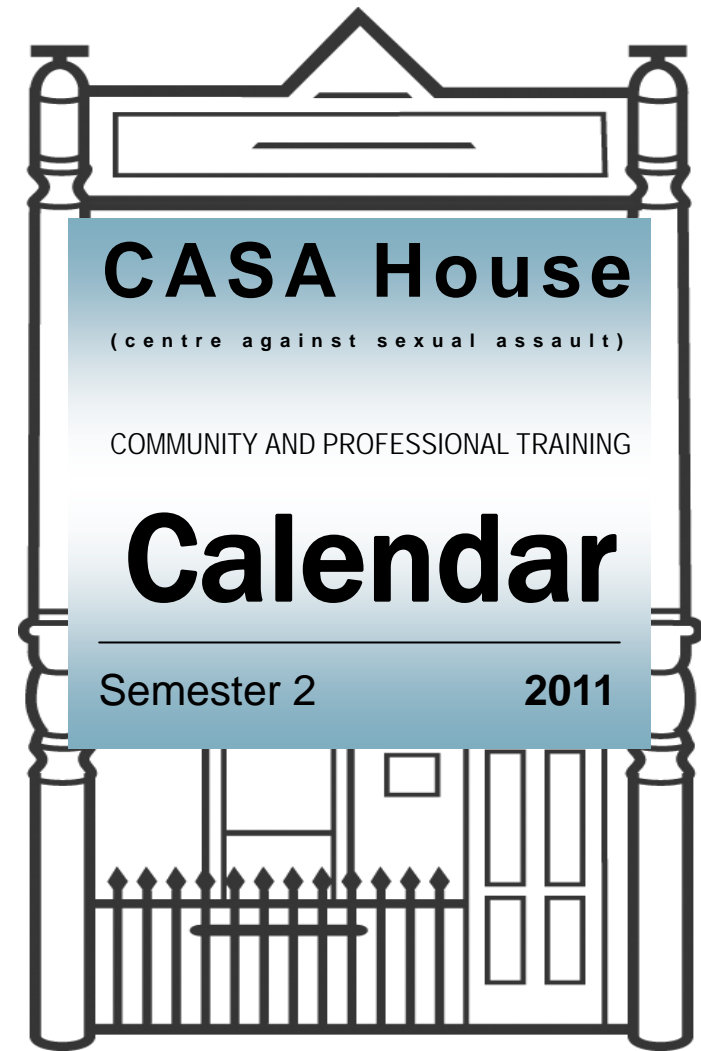

will experience sexual assault at sometime in their lives. Given these statistics it is likely that anyone working in health or human services will at some time work with people affected by sexual assault.

Responding to Sexual Assault Level 1

Tuesday, 23 August
9.30-4.30pm

- Have you considered the impact of commonly held societal beliefs on victim/survivors of sexual assault?
- Do you feel competent when someone discloses her experiences of sexual assault to you?
- Are you equipped with accurate information and skills to respond appropriately to a victim/survivor?
- Do you know how to effectively support and advocate for a victim/survivor?

This one-day workshop is designed to assist those working with victim/survivors of sexual assault who have not had the opportunity to access training previously. It is also suitable for students. The aims of this workshop include encouraging participants to examine the nature and consequences of sexual assault and to develop an understanding of the key issues relevant to providing an effective response. Participants will be provided with information relating to appropriate referral options and the supports available for those working with victim/survivors of sexual assault.

Responding to Sexual Assault Level 2

Thursday, 3 November
9.30-4.30pm

Please note: completion of Level 1 is a compulsory prerequisite to participation in Level 2

- Do you have some experience or previous training in responding to victim/survivors of past and recent sexual assault?
- Would you like to extend your skills in working with adults and young people who have experienced child sexual abuse?
- Would you like the opportunity to learn more about the trauma of sexual assault and the consequences of trauma?
- Would you like to know more about the impact of secondary trauma?

This one day workshop will extend the skills of those working with victim/survivors of sexual assault who have completed Responding to Sexual Assault - Level 1 training. Participants will actively engage with concepts and strategies consistent with a socio-political understanding of sexual assault. The workshop will strengthen theoretical foundations and practical responses to the trauma of sexual assault.

Sexual Assault and Intimate Partner Violence

- What are the intersections of sexual assault and intimate partner violence?
- Are you looking for more information about the dynamics and impacts of intimate partner sexual violence?
- Would you like to extend your skills in working with women experiencing sexual violence from intimate partners?

Given the complexities involved for women in disclosing intimate partner sexual violence (IPSV) it is important that the possibility and consequences of IPSV are incorporated into all responses and support for women experiencing family violence. This workshop will explore wider social issues and practice responses relevant to working with women experiencing IPSV.
