Public Fertility

The Women's Public Fertility Services (PFS) provides publicly funded fertility care to eligible patients across Victoria. The service delivers safe, high-quality, and person-centred care, supporting individuals throughout their fertility journey.

PFS focuses on improving access to fertility services for people who may face barriers in the private system. This includes single people, Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander Victorians, LGBTIQ+ individuals, people with disabilities, those from culturally and linguistically diverse backgrounds, people living in regional or rural areas, and people on low incomes. The service is committed to providing inclusive, respectful, and culturally safe care for all patients.

AND

Pauline Gandel Imaging Service

The Pauline Gandel Women's Imaging Centre offers a wide range of medical imaging and treatment services for adults and newborns. These services include X-ray imaging, specialised fluoroscopy procedures (which use real-time imaging to guide diagnosis and treatment), ultrasound scans for both adults and newborns, magnetic resonance imaging (MRI), MRI-guided treatments (such as ablation), and breast imaging (mammography).

The centre also provides ultrasound-guided procedures for patients who are pregnant or experiencing gynaecological conditions. These may include procedures such as amniocentesis, chorionic villus sampling, and treatments delivered directly into the uterus, such as transfusions or infusions.

Women's Health Clinics

The Women's Health Clinics is the outpatient service for patients with complex health needs. The services provided include gynaecology, contraception and abortion care, pelvic floor disorders (urogynaecology), menopause management, vulval and skin conditions, menopause after cancer treatment, breast health, oncology, early pregnancy concerns, chronic pelvic pain, and colposcopy.

The service also includes the Ambulatory Gynaecology Service, where procedures are performed without the need for hospital admission. These include minor gynaecological procedures under local anaesthetic, as well as diagnostic and procedural clinics such as urodynamic testing, insertion of intrauterine contraceptive devices (IUDs), and outpatient cystoscopy.

AND

Day Surgery Unit

Day Surgery is part of the Women's Perioperative services. In Day Surgery Graduates will gain exposure to a variety of Women's surgical procedures including, IVF, breast, gynaecological, pelvic floor, termination of pregnancy and laparoscopic surgeries.
